PRIVACY NOTICE

Holroyd Howe Limited is the controller and responsible for your personal data (collectively referred to as "Holroyd Howe", "we", "us" or "our" in this Privacy Notice).

Holroyd Howe is committed to protecting and respecting your privacy. We take your privacy very seriously and we ask that you read this Privacy Notice carefully as it contains important information on:

- a) the personal data we collect about you;
- b) how we look after your personal data when you visit our website (regardless of where you visit from);

PERSONAL DATA WHICH WE COLLECT

Personal data provided by you

We collect personal data about you when you:

The personal data collected in the above manner may include your:

Special categories of personal data

We do not proactively collect personal data considered as special category personal data via our website such as health information (e.g. allergen information). However, we ask the school to provide any allergen information so that we can cater appropriately for the student. We can only use this information if the school has obtained the explicit consent from the student's parent or legal guardian and has explained why it is being requested.

We do not ask for any special categories of personal data to be disclosed to us as part of your job application process via our website. Depending on the nature of the role,



we may have to conduct further checks at a later stage and where those checks involve special categories of personal data, we will explain why we need that information and how we intend to use it in our recruitment and selection privacy policy.

Personal data about other individuals

If you give us information on behalf of someone else, you confirm that the other person has appointed you to act on his or her behalf and has agreed that you can:

- a) give consent on his/her behalf to the processing of his/her personal data;
- b) receive on his/her behalf any data protection notices; and

MONITORING AND RECORDING COMMUNICATIONS

HOW WE USE YOUR PERSONAL DATA

Under data protection law, we can only use your personal data if we have a legal basis, e.g.:

- d) for our **legitimate interests** or those of a third party, unless there is a good reason to protect your personal data which overrides those legitimate interests. When relying on this legal basis, we will carry out an assessment to balance our interests against yours.

WHEN WE MIGHT SHARE YOUR PERSONAL DATA WITH THIRD PARTIES

We do not, and will not, sell any of your personal data to any third party - including your name, address, email address or payment card information. As an essential part of being able to provide our services to you, we do share your data with the following categories of third parties:

- a) service providers that help us to run our business such as, website hosting providers, website developers;

HOW WE KEEP YOUR PERSONAL DATA SECURE

To protect your information, we have policies and procedures that ensure only authorised personnel can access the information, that information is handled and stored in a secure and sensible manner, and all systems that can access the information have the necessary security measures in place.

All employees, contractors and sub-contractors receive the necessary training and resources to ensure they understand their responsibilities concerning our policies and procedures.

In addition to these operational measures, we also use a range of technology and security systems to reinforce these policies and procedures, including ensuring that:

- a) access to personal data is strictly restricted to those employees who need to access this information as part of their role;
- b) we store your personal data on secure servers and unauthorised external access to personal data is prevented through the use of a firewall; and
- c) payment details are encrypted using SSL technology (typically you will see a lock icon or green address bar (or both) in your browser when we use this technology).

To ensure these measures are suitable, we run regular vulnerability tests and audits to identify areas of weakness and non-compliance; these tests are routinely scheduled.

HOW LONG DO WE KEEP YOUR PERSONAL DATA

We shall only retain your information for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes we collected it for, including for the purposes of satisfying any legal, accounting, or reporting requirements. TRANSFERS OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA OUT OF THE UK and EEA

YOUR RIGHTS

The right to access information we hold about you

At any point you can contact us to request the information we hold about you as well as why we have that information, who has access to the information and where we got



the information. Once we have received your request we will respond within 30 days.

The right to correct and update the information we hold about you

If the information we hold about you is out of date, incomplete or incorrect, you can inform us and we will ensure that it is updated.

The right to have your information erased

If you feel that we should no longer be using your information or that we are illegally using your information, you can request that we erase the information we hold. When we receive your request, we will confirm whether the information has been deleted or tell you the reason why it cannot be deleted.

The right to object to processing of your information
